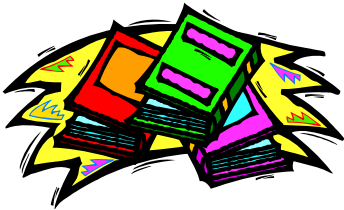

## **Super Student Awards and Jean Day Pass Reminder**

Super Student is a reward program used by St. Mary's teachers to recognize students' extraordinary achievements, kind acts and other exceptional behavior. You will recognize a "Super Student" as a small, yellow slip of paper that comes home with your child. Some weeks your child may bring home 1 or 2, other weeks they may not have any. Once teachers fill out Super Student slips, they forward them to the office. Each Friday a volunteer picks up the slips and visits each classroom with the Super Student cart for prize distribution. Each student that has earned a "Super Student" can choose a prize, usually a small toy or piece of candy, to take home, OR they can choose a Jean Day Pass. Jean Day Passes are blue slips of paper that have a specific date for which they are to be used for a non-uniform Jean Day Pass day. Usually the date corresponds with the last Thursday of the month and will be marked as such on the monthly school calendar. If your child chooses a Jean Day Pass instead of a trinket or piece of candy, please have them bring that blue "Super Student Jean Day Pass" to school with them on the jean pass day. Dear Parents:

As you know, last year we offered our parents the opportunity to view the Campus Connection and accompanying information/flyers online at our website: [www.wccsonline.org](http://www.wccsonline.org). We had quite a few families take advantage of this option.

I am writing today to encourage more of our families to utilize this option. By receiving your Campus Connection online you are helping us to be:

- More environmentally friendly. Consider the amount of paper utilized (4-5 reams/week) to stuff the Tuesday packet. Many of these pieces are then thrown away once read.
- More fiscally responsible:
  - Paper costs continue to increase. It costs us approximately \$15-\$20/week in paper to stuff the Tuesday packets.
  - Now consider the labor costs involved. Mrs. Smith and Mrs. Baumann spend 2-3 hours each week copying and stuffing these packets – and that is with the help of a volunteer.

I do know that many of you tried to receive the Campus Connection online last year but did not like the format, etc. We have made a few minor changes that I believe make it a bit easier to read. I encourage you – before deciding – to please go to the website at [www.wccsonline.org](http://www.wccsonline.org) and click on the Newsletter button. Then click on the link for the most recent St. Mary Campus Connection. There you will find exactly what you would receive as a hard copy in the packet – flyers and all.

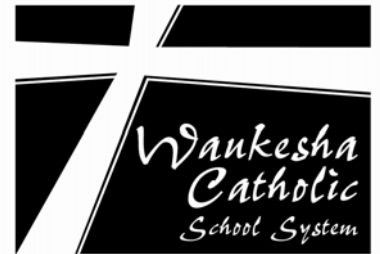
If you select to receive your Campus Connection online you will receive an email each week indicating when it is available for viewing. You will also continue to receive your plastic Tuesday folder with the signature card and possibly some forms that need to be signed and returned (such as hot lunch, permission slips, volunteer sign-up, etc) or flyers that were provided to us already copied. Please continue to look for the Tuesday folder each week. Hopefully, more often than not, it will simply contain the signature card for you to sign and return like you currently do. The plastic folder will also serve as another reminder for you to check online to view the Campus Connection in its entirety and as a vehicle to return any completed paperwork to school.

If you are willing to receive your Campus Connection online- you do not need to do anything. We will simply continue to email you the link indicating it is ready. If you still feel the need to receive all of the contents in the hard copy format, please complete the form on the back of this letter and return it to school no later than Friday, September 23<sup>rd</sup>. Then, beginning Tuesday, September 27<sup>th</sup> we will send hard copies of the packets to those families that returned forms –everyone else will view it online.

I truly appreciate you taking the time to consider this option and hope you see the benefits of viewing the Campus Connection online.

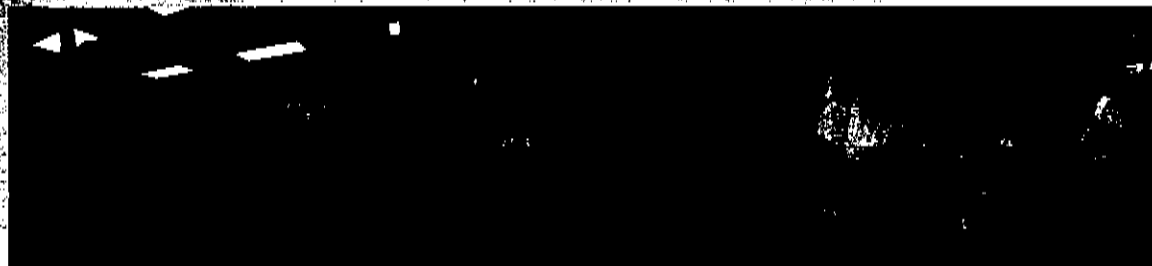

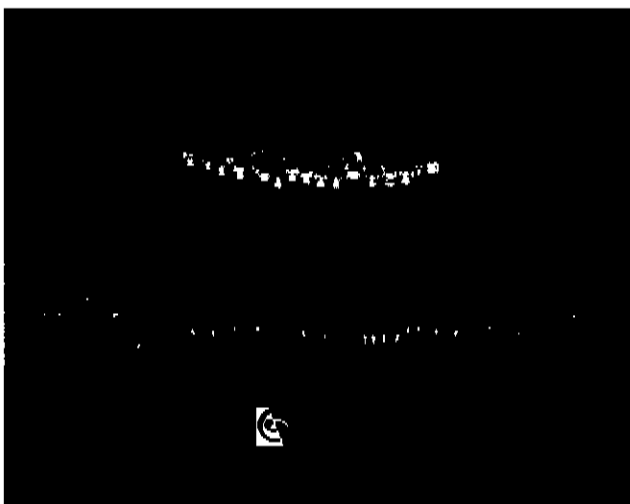
