MORE MULTIPLE INTELLIGENCES!!!

Last week we briefly looked at the eight "multiple intelligences." Hopefully you had a chance to think about the ones you use a lot and those you see your children using. No one is better than the other. In reality we need all of them to be fully alive people. This week we look at four of them in more depth and list activities you and/or your children might engage in.

Linguistic intelligence:

- Roles that require this intelligence: writer, lawyer, comedian, homilist, poet, coach, teacher
- Products which require linguistic intelligence: newspapers, discussions, theatre, word games, debate, speech
- Everyday uses: reading the paper, writing a letter, participating in a meeting
- Activities for children: writing stories, poetry, making speeches, doing plays, reading, debate teams

Logical-mathematical intelligence:

- Roles that require this intelligence: math teacher, scientist, engineer, architect, computer programmer, knitter, accountant
- Products which require this intelligence: graph, spreadsheet, equation, logic puzzle, lawyers' brief
- Everyday uses: reading a bus schedule, solving puzzles, balancing the checkbook
- Activities for children: Suduko, puzzles, math problems, investments, Future Cities Project

Musical Intelligence:

- Roles that require this intelligence: musician, choreographer, disc jockey, composer, cheerleader
- Products which require this intelligence: songwriting, parodies to songs, jingles, dance set to music, recital performances, soundtracks
- Everyday uses: listening and appreciating music, playing a musical instrument or singing,
- Activities for children: listening to music, being able to distinguish sounds and musical instruments, playing an instrument, singing

Spatial Intelligence

- Roles that require this intelligence: gardener, sculptor, surgeon, mechanic, photographer, athlete
- Products which require this intelligence: paintings, models, invention, diagrams, blueprints, sculpture
- Everyday uses: finding one's way in unfamiliar area, giving directions, playing board games, arranging flowers, decorating a room
- Activities for children: all sorts of art activities, map reading, map making

We are trying to give your children a variety of learning experiences building on the various intelligences. We hope you too can encourage them in these areas.

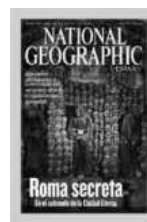
