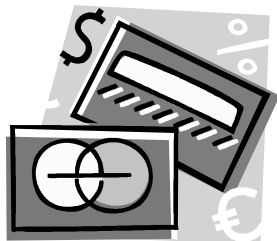

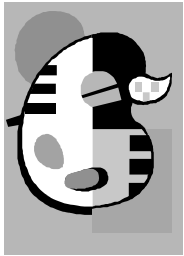
Athletic News -Waukesha Catholic Sport Sign Up

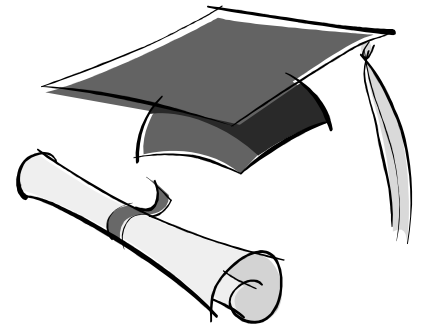
Martial Artist Training

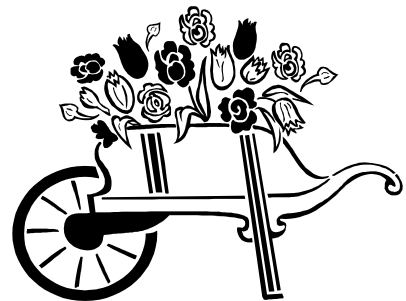

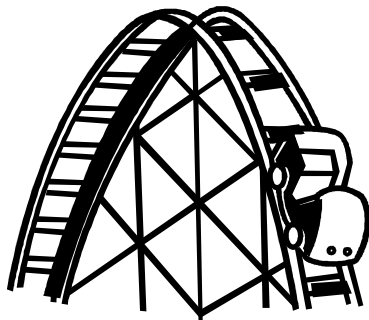
