FAMILY SPRING INVENTORY

Pope John Paul II used the expression that the “family is the Church in miniature.” The rich experience of the sacramental life of the Church is rooted in healthy family life. The following inventory reflects the essence of the sacraments—Christ’s presence in welcoming, nurturing, storytelling, healing, forgiving, serving, reflecting on meaning, expressing gratitude, knowing one another and just being in communion with one another.

Stimulate family community bondedness by having each member of the family answer and discuss the following statements. (Adapt to age of children, of if the children are very young, do this inventory as parents.)

1. I celebrate something wonderful at least once a week!
2. I make a point of “hanging out” with my family each week.
3. My family knows when I am worried about something and what I’m worried about.
4. My family knows when I am praying or that I pray often.
5. Our home is a welcoming and nurturing, with meals and stories shared regularly.
6. I can see the positive side of things even when they go wrong.
7. I listen to the stories of my family and tell stories from my childhood.
8. I think my children have some things to teach me.
9. I admit I’m wrong to my children/parents, when I am and appropriately ask for forgiveness.
10. I can laugh at my own mistakes.
11. I give my children/parents unexpected treats just because...
12. I acknowledge small accomplishments.
13. I show respect to all and try to be a healing force.
14. I have told my parents/children/spouse how much they mean to me within the last week.
15. I avoid name-calling and put downs.
16. I see myself acting in Christ-like ways often.
17. I am able at the end of the day to put things in perspective and begin fresh in the morning.
18. I am optimistic and hopeful.
19. I don’t sweat the small stuff and focus on what really matters.
20. I say thank you to each person in my family at least once a day!

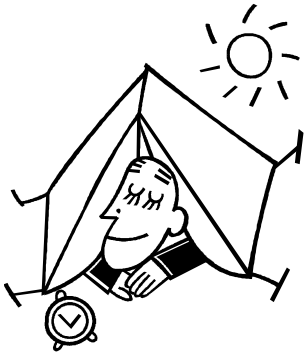
